#### Principles

- National data providers = owners
- EBCC is allowed:
  - -to use and communicate on aggregated data
  - -To conduct explorative analysis for scientific purposes
- Proper acknowledgements of data providers

## Principles

Co-authorship

- data providers to be informed in advance and offered coauthorship
- Active involvement in the process of writing the scientific paper is needed to justify co-authorship
- National data only: If the leading author sends an almost ready manuscript (that is usually difficult to contribute), all data providers willing to contribute shall be co-authors

#### Policy in practice in PECBMS

- Standard deliveries of aggregated results for policy and promotional purposes
- All request from researchers discussed within Steering Group and EBCC Board
- One paper using supranational data (published)
- Three projects using national data (not published yet)
- No request from commercial sector

#### Observations

- Takes time to get answers from data providers
- Researchers might not always like many co-authors
