- •Participants are familiar with the IUCN classification schemes (e.g. similar reporting for IBA's, World Bird Database, Species action plans and national databooks ).
- •Does the World Bird Database use the same classification as the IUCN?
- •How are the data going to be compiled, online tool, Excel/Access form?

## Summary carousel session threats and conservation actions

- For which species is it needed to collect data on threats and conservation actions?
  - For the Birds Directive Article 12 reporting data should
  - be collected only for certain species.

    For the European Red list data should be collected for all the species.
- Filling in this information is a lot of work and it may be difficult to get funding for it.
- Is it possible to use the same classification for reporting on threats for the European Red list project and Article 12
- Is it possible to fill in the data only once for all the projects? This would minimise the work.

## Summary carousel session threats and conservation actions

- It is recommended to use existing data on threats like data published in Species Action Plans.
- People find difficult to determine the main threats and to prioritise.
- It would be good to be able to distinguish threats based on expert knowledge from threats based on published evidence.
- People think that there is no direct link between the classification schemes of threats and conservation actions.
